1. Introduction:

The Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA) – a dynamic authority established in 2023 with an expanded mandate for overseeing the overall public procurement, has been making bold footsteps in bringing effective reforms in the procurement law and rules, side by side taking newer initiatives to make the system smarter to keep pace with the ever-changing global trends and technological updates.

Evolving from the former Central Procurement Technical Unit (CPTU), BPPA has placed strong emphasis on making public procurement sustainable. To this end, it has already formulated the Sustainable Public Procurement (SPP) Policy and Guidelines, designed to support Bangladesh’s commitment to achieving the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) by 2030, and also reformed and formulated public procurement rules -2025. Recognizing that such transformations require robust communication strategies to raise awareness, foster stakeholder engagement, and accelerate capacities in both e-GP and SPP, BPPA has prioritized extensive communication initiatives under the Digitizing Implementation Monitoring and Public Procurement Project (DIMAPPP) – 3rd Revised.

Bangladesh Center for Communication Programs (BCCP) has been assigned as a consulting firm in March to December 2025. During this period, BCCP developed a Strategic Communication Plan, conducted various activities to strengthen communication efforts and capacity-building initiatives among diverse stakeholders, thereby assisting BPPA in advancing the adoption of sustainable public procurement and reinforcing the use of the electronic government procurement (e-GP) system. During this phase, the amendment of the Public Procurement Rules (PPR) 2008 and introduction of the newly enacted Public Procurement Rules, 2025 by BPPA was also initiated. Hence, BCCP provided all round support in promoting the amendment as well as the new rules of public procurement across national and local level.



2. Project Overview:

In early 2017, the Government initiated the World Bank-financed “Digitizing Implementation Monitoring and Public Procurement Project (DIMAPPP)” with the objective of strengthening public procurement performance and enhancing institutional capacity for implementation monitoring of development programs and projects. World Bank financing for the project concluded on 31 December 2023.

Following the closure of World Bank financing, the project was extended through two additional phases up to 31 December 2025 under the “Revised Technical Assistance Project Proposal (RTAPP)”, with financing provided by the Government. BCCP, having previously supported DIMAPPP through communication and advocacy, has been assigned as a “Consulting Firm” to lead these efforts. BCCP’s role is vital here as it has expanded communication and capacity-building efforts among stakeholders, aiming at supporting BPPA in promoting its objectives and goals.



3. Implementation Approach:

As the project primarily focused on raising awareness among stakeholders regarding the transition of the Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA), its role in shaping modern procurement standards, strengthening stakeholder engagement, amending the existing Public Procurement Rules (PPR), and enacting revised PPR provisions, as well as promoting these reforms across diverse public procurement practices, BCCP developed a comprehensive communication plan. The plan was implemented through a series of well-structured and coordinated activities, guided by the Strategic Communication Process, to ensure effective engagement with key stakeholders and to achieve the objectives defined under this consulting assignment.

The communication interventions were divided into four (04) key domains of Strategic and Behavioral Change Communication (SBCC) activities, as outlined below:



The Scope of Work Includes:

- Multi-media Campaigns to raise visibility and adoption of BPPA initiatives.
- Stakeholder Engagement through experience sharing to encourage operational excellence.
- Capacity Building for Women Tenderers to enhance their active participation in public procurement.
- Sensitization of Media and Citizen to create a supportive environment for procurement reforms.
- Knowledge Management to document and disseminate insights, experiences, and innovations.

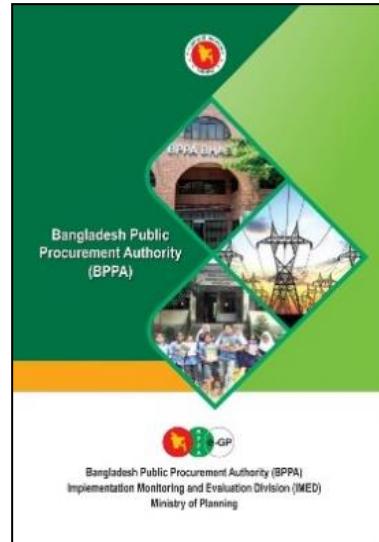
Branding and promotion of BPPA through social media campaigns and advocacy with various stakeholders have been prioritized in this phase, as Sustainable Public Procurement is a relatively new concept to many. Additionally, the amendment of PPR, 2008, and the enactment of the new PPR, 2025, require focus to become a familiar topic. For this purpose, BCCP made additional efforts to bring effective coordination among the relevant stakeholders to achieve the above-mentioned objectives.



4. Key Activities Performed:

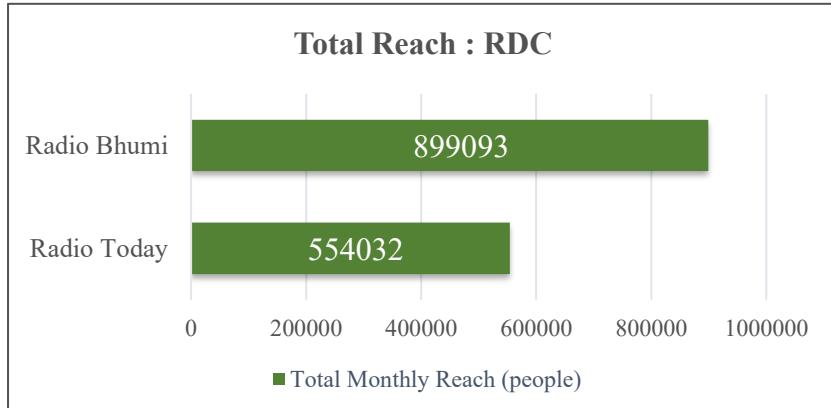
a. Campaign for Community Engagement:

- i) A dynamic **strategic communication plan** was developed to conduct the planned activities, followed by an inception meeting. The plan was revised and finalized as per BPPA's approval.
- ii) All relevant **communication materials**, such as: Folder with information, Notebook, a set of Factsheets, Brochure, etc., have been reviewed, revised, and printed for distribution among the stakeholders during workshops / meetings / programs. (A total of 2000 sets were printed).
- iii) A **video documentary** was developed for BPPA to promote e-GP as a complete online system. This documentary was displayed in 35 workshops and orientation programs with stakeholders at the local and national levels. Additionally, three TVCs developed in previous phases on the following topics: Formation of BPPA, Success of e-GP, and Women Tenderers in e-GP were also used during this project phase. These were also shared during workshops and on the official Facebook page of BPPA and watched by considerable numbers of stakeholders.

- iv) A **thematic Jingle** “**উন্নয়নে টেকসই ক্রয়- বিপিপিএ-এর প্রত্যয়**” has been developed for BPPA to connect the audience with the campaign theme across various events. - v) One 60-second **audio advertisement on e-GP** was developed for broadcasting. The advertisement was broadcast on two FM Radio channels (Radio Today and Radio Bhumi) from August 2025, accompanied by an endorsement from a radio jockey. **Around 14,53,125 people** were reached during the month-long campaign across the two channels.

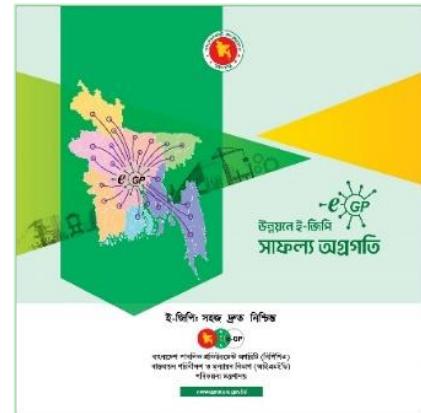
- vi) A total of 10 **TV Scrolling Messages** were developed and disseminated (as per the approved schedule of BPPA) on 2 national TV Channels (Jamuna TV and ATN News).

The airing continued for 60 days (20 July-20 September 2025), scrolled 10 times per hour, and each was approximately viewed by 2900 times within this period.

vii) BCCP developed 5 **public service announcements (PSAs)** in consultation with BPPA, which have been uploaded to the social media platform of BPPA. Besides, a number of PSAs developed in the previous phase were also posted and viewed by the stakeholders. More than **10,36,765** people were reached with the messages disseminated through PSAs. viii) A **Café Table Book** containing several success stories of different stakeholders (including procuring entities, tenderers, and business community) earned through e-GP has been developed and 1000 copies distributed for Selected Public Sector Organizations (SPSOs), and relevant stakeholders for advocacy.



b. Capacity Building of Stakeholders through Engagement:

i) A total of 12 **interactive workshops** were conducted to exchange experiences and views of the key stakeholders for smooth and full utilization of e-GP across all sectors at the district level, and to gather their insights about the reform of PPR 2008 and identify issues/rules required modification or amendment. A total of **812** relevant stakeholders from procuring entities, tenderers, banks, and media, along with the officials from respective DC offices, attended these workshops. The detailed workshop reports have been shared with BPPA.

ii) Emphasizing women's empowerment and their inclusion in public procurement, **two workshops for women** tenderers and entrepreneurs were organized during this project phase. The first one was organized in the Dhaka district, and the other one was held in Khulna district. A total of **60 women tenderers** and entrepreneurs attended these workshops.



These workshops specifically addressed the challenges faced by women tenderers and discussed how the reforms of PPR 2008 would support them in the smooth and effective execution of their work. Comprehensive reports detailing the proceedings and outcomes of the workshops were duly submitted to BPPA.

- iii) Four (04) **sensitization and experience sharing meetings** on e-GP and Public Procurement were organized at four upazila. Around **143 participants** from procuring entities, tenderers, and other government officials attended these programs. These meetings helped in gathering local-level experiences and recommendations to enhance the effectiveness of public procurement outcomes. The reports of the sensitization and experience-sharing meetings have been shared with BPPA.
- iv) Four (04) **orientation programs** on public procurement and e-GP were organized for the upazila level stakeholders to inform them about BPPA and its activities, increase accurate knowledge about e-GP, facilitate its use, and bring about changes in the mindset and behavior of the key stakeholders. Around **127 participants** from procuring entities, tenderers, and other government officials attended these programs. Additionally, hands-on training to the participants through e-GP demonstration to make tendering process smooth and successful by using the e-GP system were also provided during these programs by the resource persons. Reports of the orientation programs have been shared with BPPA.
- v) A total of eight (08) **display board on e-GP and Helpdesk Information** was installed at UNO Office premises following the upazila level sensitization and orientation programs. The purpose was to promote e-GP as well as BPPA's HelpDesk services to make public procurement familiar, easier and hassle-free. This board works as a source of ready reference for the tenderers as well as the concerned citizens.



c. Reform of Public Procurement Rules and Enactment of New PPR, 2025:

- i) One workshop was arranged with the audit and accounts officials on the topic of delegation of financial power and PPR, 2008. A total of 31 officials attended the

workshop. The purpose was to share issues related to audit findings in public procurement that required a clear understanding and clarification, aligning with compliance of procurement rules and procedures. The report was shared with BPPA following the workshop completion.

ii) Three workshops were conducted with the Technical Working Group (TWG) members at Gazipur and Dhaka. The first workshop was for the amendment of PPR, 2008, held at Gazipur district; the second was on sharing the draft proposed PPR, 2025; and the last one on the implementation plan/strategy of PPR, 2025.



Reports of the workshops with TWG have been shared with BPPA.

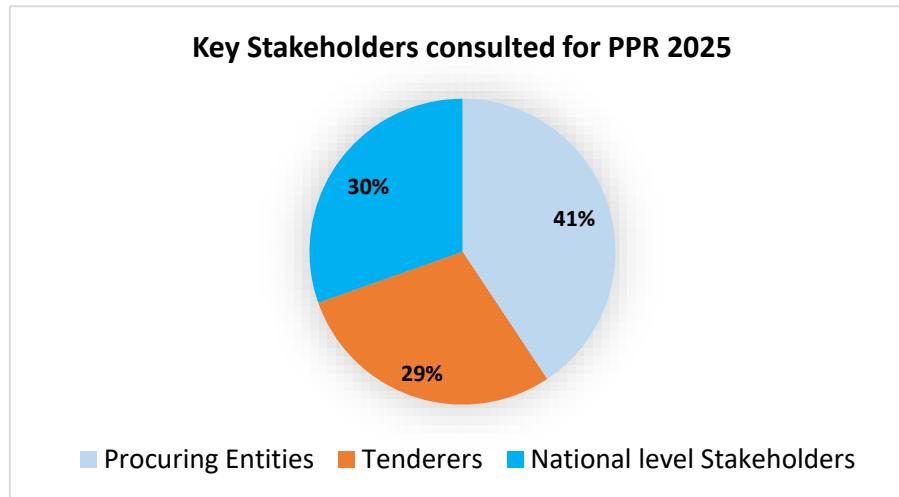
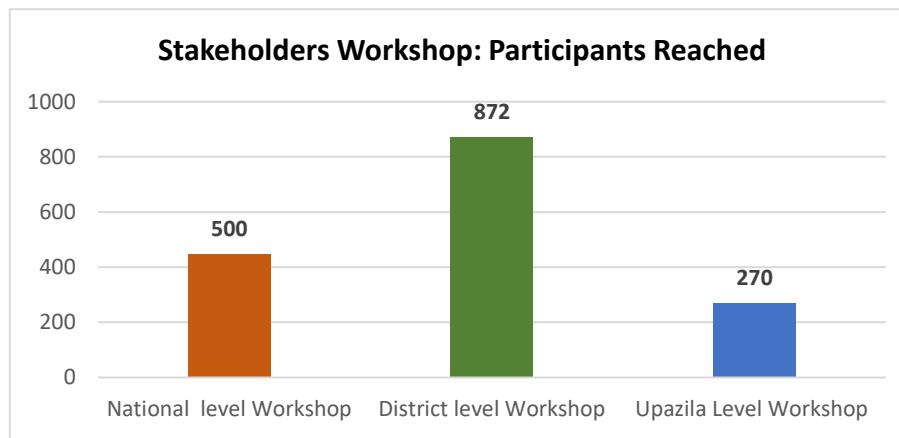
iii) During this reporting period, BPPA also conducted nine (9) consultation workshops with the representatives of Selected Public Sector Organizations (SPSOs), National Trainers, Ministry-level officials, and IMED officials. The purpose of these workshops was to engage participants and solicit their valuable feedback and recommendations, in order to ensure that the prioritization of rules for amendment and the enactment of PPR 2025 would be appropriate, timely, and responsive to practical needs. A total of 386 officials joined these workshops, along with officials of BPPA. All the reports of these consultation workshops have been sent to BPPA.



Highlights of the Key Components of PPR 2025

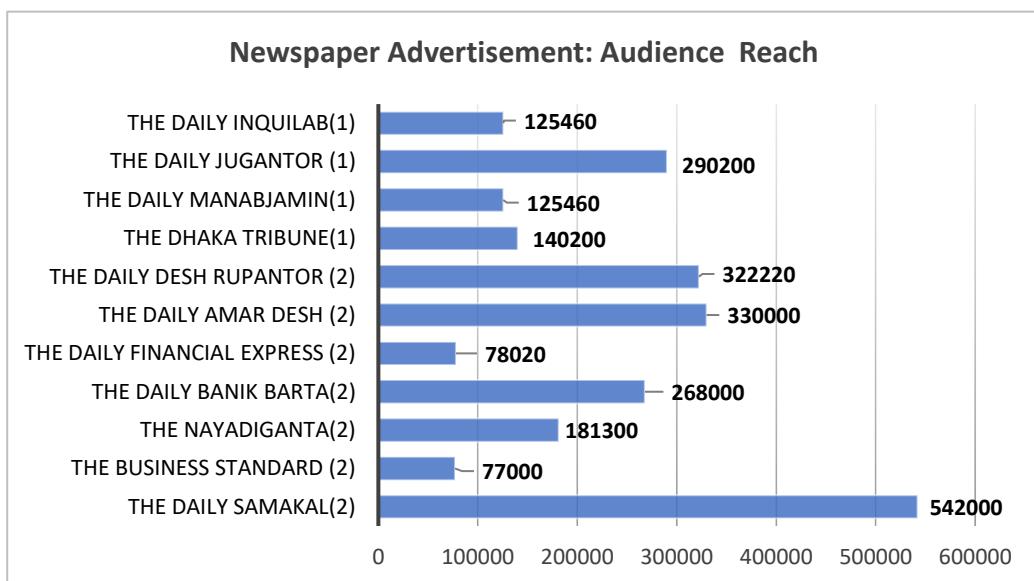
- * Rewriting the principles of public procurement.
- * Inclusion of Four types of procurement (which are: Goods, Works, Physical Services, Intellectual and Professional Services) instead of three types.
- * Categorizing of economic operators (which are: Supplier, Contractor, Service provider, and Consultant).
- * Inclusion of provisions to encourage the participation of women-owned enterprises (WoEs) in public procurement.
- * Inclusion of Sustainable Public Procurement (SPP) Rules.

- * Mandatory implementation of price adjustment-related provisions.
- * Imposing the obligation to prepare a procurement plan through the e-GP.
- * Procurement rules when the BPPA Standard Document is unavailable.
- * Revision of rules for Variation, Performance Security, and Retention Money.
- * Application of the limited tendering method (LTM).
- * Clarification of contract cancellation process.
- * Reverse Auction and Direct Procurement Method.
- * Debarment review committee.
- * Identify and evaluate significantly low-priced tenders, etc.



d. Media Engagement:

i) BCCP designed two advertisements; each of those was published 9 times (a total of 18) in 11 national newspapers. These were on “e-GP is Mandatory for Public Procurement” and “PPR 2025 is now enacted.”. The publication was done in two phases from 20 July to 30 July, 2025, and from 10 October to 18 October, 2025. These advertisements reached approximately **2,479,860** audiences.



ii) Additionally, BCCP engaged print media journalists to publish articles about the functions of BPPA and the achievements of e-GP and provided support with data and information to draft three articles based on this theme. These articles were published in The Dhaka Tribune and The Nayadiganta approximately reached **321,500** audiences.

BCCP also worked with the electronic media to air brief news clips on BPPA and its role in e-GP as well as the importance of new PPR 2025 for transparency and accountability of public procurement.

iii) BCCP also helped publish the news of the meeting, workshops, and orientation programs (which were organized and facilitated by BCCP). A total of **109 news** was published in national and local dailies and online media that reached a huge number of people. The news coverage collectively reached approximately **25,794,420** audience, including viewership from BTV.

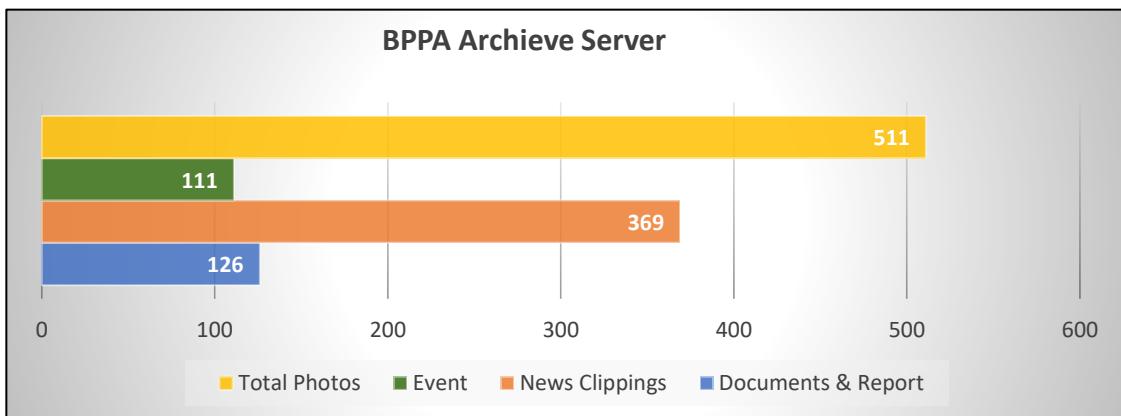

iv) A workshop was organized solely for the journalists and media personnel to inform them regarding the activities of BPPA for the amendment as well as the new PPR, 2025. Around 55 journalists from electronic and print media attended this workshop. The report was submitted to BPPA following the workshop conduction.

e. Documentation:

Documentation is an essential component of a project as it helps one to stay updated about the current status, progress, drawbacks, and necessary actions to take for a smooth implementation of the project's activities. As the communication consultant of BPPA, BCCP provided necessary support in the documentation process, as follows:

- i) BCCP provided support to BPPA for carrying out media tracking, and clipping of the articles, media reporting, or news on public procurement and other media-related activities of BPPA.
- ii) BCCP provided need-based support in the management and maintenance of BPPA Digital Archive. During this project period, a total of 1,117 data (that includes 511 photos, 111 events, 369 e-GP & BPPA related news clippings and 126 documents & reports) has been uploaded in BPPA archive.



- iii) BCCP gathered news and reports of different programs and events of BPPA held from March to December 2025 and shared with BPPA for documentation.

- iv) Three bilingual newsletters of BPPA were published during this tenure. BCCP provided all necessary support to the development and publication of the newsletters.

- v) BCCP also provided necessary support to BPPA to prepare and publish the Annual Report (July 2024 – June 2025). BCCP worked in consultation with BPPA – prepared the outline of the Annual Report, compiled and analyzed the documents and reports, drafting the contents, and illustrated the report. This is first ever annual report of BPPA.



5. Major Outcomes:

The brief of the key achievements during this reporting period is mentioned below for a quick glimpse:

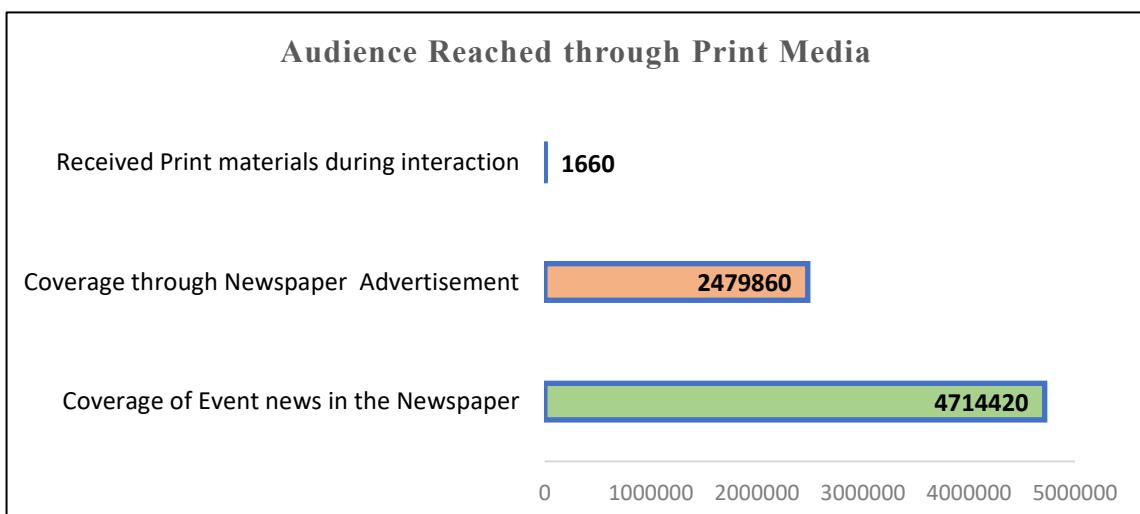
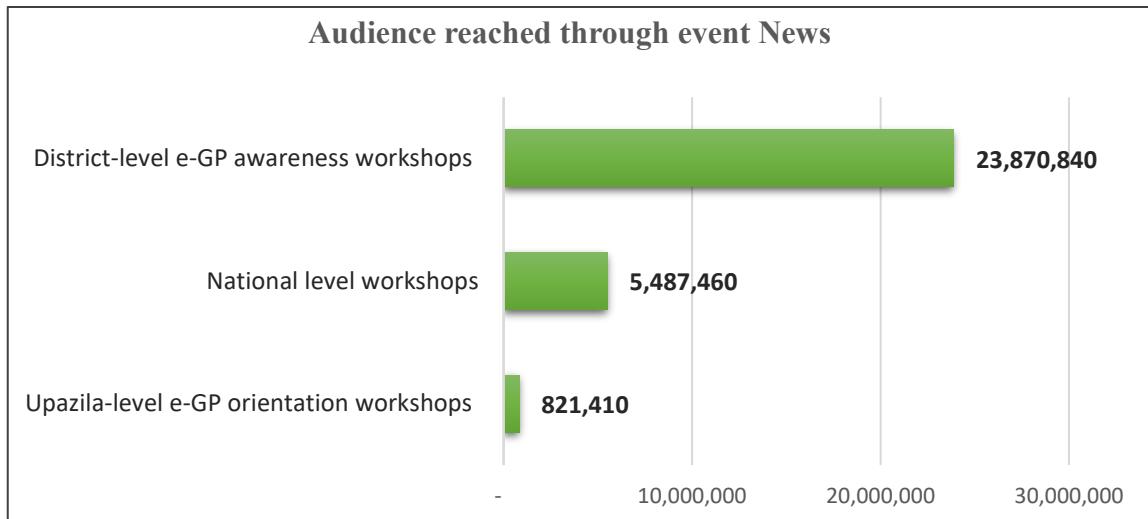
- ✓ **Capacity Building:** A total of 554 government officials from different ministries and departments were capacitated through the workshops at central, district and upazila level, helping them enhance their understanding in public procurement practices.
- ✓ **Stakeholders' Engagement:** Total 1660 participants (including PEs, Tenderers, Bankers and Journalists) were engaged through the workshops/orientations/meetings at central, district and upazila level.
- ✓ **Common Queries/Concerns Shared:** There were a few concerns/queries asked by the stakeholders of e-GP in the open discussion session. All the relevant queries were documented in the reports and shared with BPPA for review and appropriate measures.

A Snapshot of Commonly Raised Queries and Concerns

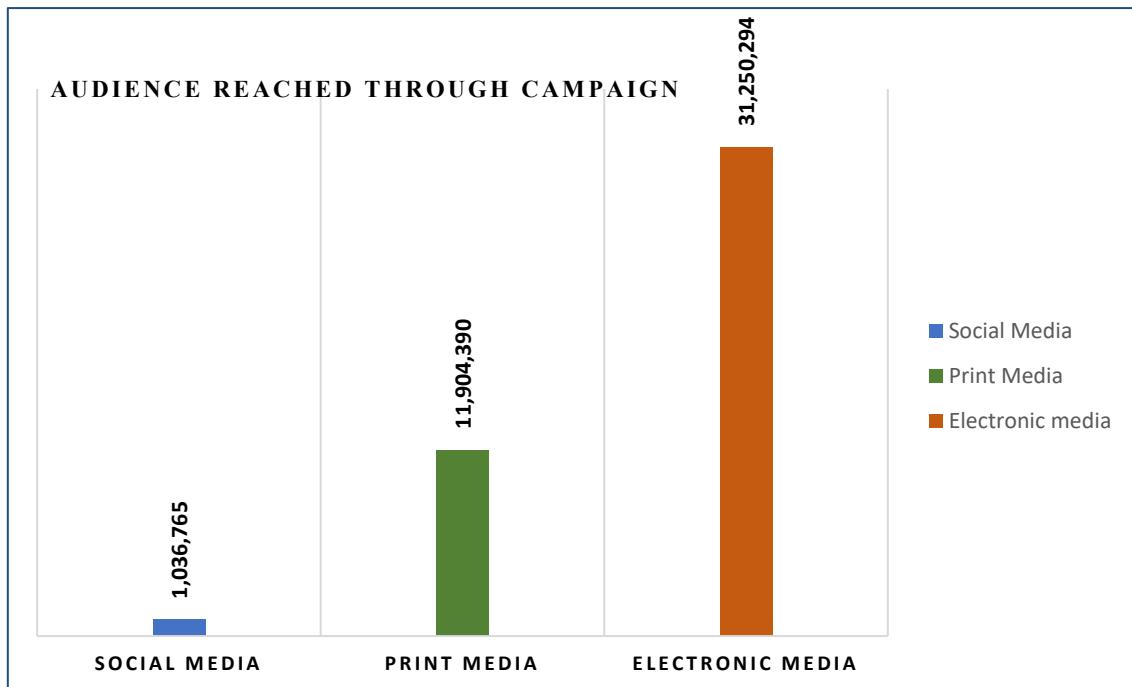
- 1) What does the term “**significantly low price**” mean in the tender evaluation process? Does quoting a very low price lead to automatic disqualification?
- 2) When a tender is rejected by the Review Panel, can the **specific reasons for disqualification** be communicated to the bidder for future improvement?
- 3) Are contractors permitted to **subcontract the awarded work**?
- 4) If the Procuring Entity **delays handing over the worksite**, how is the **contract duration adjusted** to account for the delay?
- 5) How are **new or less-experienced tenderers** encouraged to participate, given that higher marks are usually awarded to organizations with extensive prior experience?
- 6) What mechanisms are in place to ensure **timely payment of bills** to tenderers after completion of work?
- 7) Since piloting of e-CMS has already been completed, when will it be **rolled out for wider implementation**?
- 8) If **VAT or tax rates increase after contract award**, how does the Procuring Entity **adjust the contract price**?
- 9) What measures are taken to ensure that tender awards are based on **both price and quality**, rather than on the lowest bid alone?
- 10) Why do many Procuring Entities prefer **LTM** over **OTM** for small-value tenders, thereby restricting wider participation?

- ✓ **Participants Feedback and Recommendations:** Several feedback and recommendations for improving the overall procurement practices of the country were received from the participants in the open discussion session of the awareness programs. Those were also documented and shared with BPPA for further consideration.

- ✓ **Media Coverage:** BCCP put sincere effort in media outreach. Therefore, the coverage on different national and local dailies, online news portals, and TV channels reached a new dimension.



- ✓ **Informing about the Amendments of PPR, 2008:** As the Public Procurement Rules (PPR) 2008, has been reformed, the users as well as the stakeholders of the e-GP system were informed regarding the issue. Their recommendations and suggestions were also received and shared with BPPA for making the reform activities more impactful.
- ✓ **Enactment of PPR, 2025:** As the PPR,2008 has been amended, and PPR, 2025 were enacted, the users as well as the stakeholders of the e-GP system were informed regarding the issue. Their recommendations and suggestions were also considered while the new rules for procurement were finalized.

Communication Plan

The primary purpose of the communication component is to increase awareness of BPPA’s role and stakeholder engagement across public procurement practices to create a supportive environment for procurement reforms.

The key objectives of the communication component include:

1. Raising nationwide awareness of BPPA’s mandate and functions.
2. Promoting understanding and application of Sustainable Public Procurement (SPP).
3. Driving adoption of the e-GP system across all sectors.

To achieve these objectives, the **key approaches** for communication interventions are:

- **National Level Campaign:** to bolster BPPA’s public image.
- **Stakeholders Engagement:** to play their role in public procurement as responsible

Electronic Government Procurement made mandatory

DHAKA, Nov 19, 2025 (BSS) - S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed, Chief Executive Officer (Secretary) of the Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA), said that under the Public Procurement Rules, 2025 (PPR, 2025), the use of electronic Government Procurement (e-GP) is mandatory in public procurement.

However, procuring entities in various parts of the country that still lack adequate ICT facilities, as well as the necessary skills and manpower to operate the e-GP system, must obtain approval from BPPA—through their respective Head of Procuring Entity (HoPE)—for permission to process tenders manually for a limited period.

Moin made these remarks while delivering his speech as the Chief Guest at an orientation workshop on the Public Procurement Rules, 2025 (PPR, 2025) and e-GP, held at the conference room of the Chattogram Deputy Commissioner's Office today. The workshop was organized by the BPPA, said a press release.

As one of the key activities under the Digitizing Implementation Monitoring and Public Procurement Project (DIMAPPP) being implemented by the Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA) under IMED of the Ministry of Planning, behavior change communication activities on public procurement are being carried out.

Through these activities, efforts are being made to raise awareness and encourage stakeholders and citizens regarding the Public Procurement Rules, 2025 (PPR 2025), electronic Government Procurement (e-GP) system, functions of BPPA, and the Sustainable Public Procurement.

As part of this initiative, a dissemination workshop on the Public Procurement Rules, 2025 (PPR 2025) and e-GP was held with procuring entities and tenderers involved in the public procurement process, in Chattogram district today.

Bangladesh Center for Communication Programs (BCCP), as BPPA's consulting firm for implementing this activity, managed the workshop.

S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed, Chief Executive Officer (Secretary) of BPPA, was the Chief Guest at the workshop. Dr. Md. Zia Uddin, Commissioner (Additional Secretary) of Chattogram Division, attended as the Special Guest. The workshop was chaired by Mohammad Zahidul Islam Mian, Deputy Commissioner and District Magistrate of Chattogram.

A total of 64 participants, comprising representatives from various procuring entities and tenderers in Chattogram, took part in the workshop.

Shah Eyamin-Ui Islam, Director (Deputy Secretary) of BPPA and National Procurement Trainer, delivered a detailed presentation on PPR 2025. Mohammad Ali Ahmed Khan, Director (Deputy Secretary) of BPPA, was also present in the workshop.

On the same day, another workshop on PPR 2025 awareness and e-GP was held in the conference room of Hathazari Upazila Parishad from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM, with procuring entities and tenderers involved in the public procurement process in Hathazari Upazila of Chattogram district.

The Chief Guest at the Hathazari workshop was S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed, while Muhammad Abdullah Al Mumin, Upazila Nirbahi Officer of Hathazari, presided over the session.

Women tenderers hail pro-women provisions in PPR

Women tenderers at a workshop on the Public Procurement Rules (PPR), 2025 and electronic Government Procurement (e-GP), held in Khulna Thursday, praised the newly enacted rules for encouraging women's participation in public procurement.

The PPR, 2025 introduces specific provisions aimed at boosting the engagement of women-owned enterprises (WoEs) in public procurement.

Participants described these provisions as highly positive, saying these would increase women's registration on the e-GP platform and enhance their overall participation in public procurement processes.

The workshop was organized by the Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA) at the Circuit House conference room in Khulna, with facilitation support from the Bangladesh Center for Communication Programs (BCCP), said a press release.

BPPA Chief Executive Officer (Secretary) S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed attended the event as chief guest. Khulna Divisional Commissioner (Additional Secretary) Md. Mokhtar Ahmed joined as special guest, while A. S. M. Zamshed Khondaker presided over the session.

A total of 31 women tenderers from Khulna participated in the session.

Addressing the participants, the BPPA CEO emphasized that women constitute half of the country's population, and meaningful national development is impossible without empowering such a significant portion of society."That is why several provisions have been incorporated into the PPR 2025 for your convenience. We are here in Khulna today to listen to your views," BPPA CEO said.

Some women tenderers expressed that they do not want to merely sign tender documents on behalf of their husbands; rather, they aspire to manage procurement activities independently.

Women tenderers urged BPPA to take initiatives to bring women to the forefront of procurement practices. The Divisional Commissioner assured participants that the issues raised would be addressed.

The Deputy Commissioner of Khulna noted that this was the first such workshop in his 15-year service career where he had the opportunity to interact directly with women tenderers, a sentiment the Divisional Commissioner also endorsed.

The PPR 2025 came into effect on 28 September 2025, following the effectiveness of the amended Public Procurement Act, 2006.

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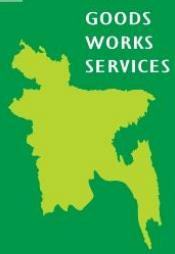

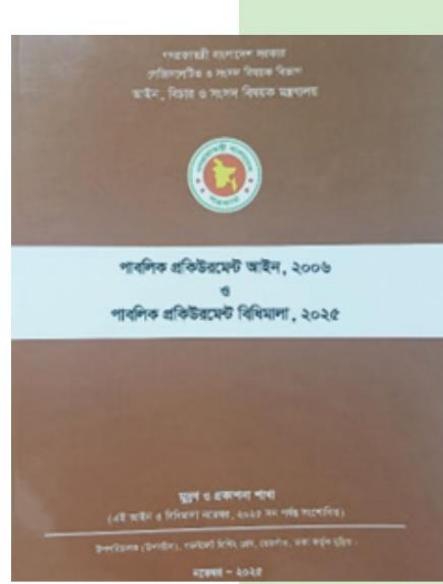
PPR, 2025 comes into effect

With a view to strengthening governance and ensuring transparency, efficiency and competition in public procurement practices, the Public Procurement Rules, 2025 (PPR, 2025) became effective from 28 September 2025, following the effectiveness of the Public Procurement (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025 (The Ordinance No. 16 of 2025) on 28 September 2025 that has brought major changes to the Public Procurement Act, 2006.

To align the corresponding rules with the amended PPA, 2006, the new PPR, 2025 was framed and made effective on 28 September 2025, the same day.

With this, both the amended PPA, 2006 and the newly-framed PPR, 2025 are effective simultaneously for conducting public procurement in the country. The new PPR, 2025 consists of 154 Rules and 21 Schedules. Major changes to both the law and the rules include:

- ❑ Removal of the 10% (plus-minus) price cap in national works procurement;
- ❑ Mandatory use of e-GP for all public procurement;
- ❑ Mandatory disclosure of the actual beneficial owner of contract awards;
- ❑ Formal introduction of Sustainable Public Procurement (SPP);
- ❑ Requirement for a procurement strategy;
- ❑ Recognition of physical services as a distinct procurement category;
- ❑ Expansion of framework agreements and negotiations;
- ❑ Establishment of a Debarment Board;
- ❑ Clear provisions on asset disposal.



The formulation of the new PPR, 2025 followed the effectiveness of the Public Procurement (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025, which was gazetted on 4 May 2025. Immediately after these amendments, the Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA) initiated the task of drafting the new Rules.

**e-GP support
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Journalists apprised of proposed PPR, 2025



The Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA) informed journalists about key aspects in the proposed Public Procurement Rules (PPR), 2025, at a workshop held in the conference room of the Implementation Monitoring and Evaluation Division (IMED), Ministry of Planning, in Dhaka, on 10 September 2025.

More than 50 journalists from national newspapers, television channels, online news portals, and news agencies attended the workshop, which was organized by BPPA and managed by the Bangladesh Center for Communication Programs (BCCP).

The event was part of BPPA's ongoing series of stakeholder consultations on the proposed PPR, 2025, for over the past two months. Secretary of IMED, Mr. Md Kamal Uddin, attended the programme as the chief guest, while BPPA's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and Secretary, Mr. S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed, presided over the session.

Mr. Shah Eyamin-Ul Islam, Director of BPPA, presented the important features of the proposed PPR, 2025, to the journalists. He has made presentations at each of the consultation workshops so far organized by BPPA on the subject.

The Secretary of IMED said that the workshop was organized to inform journalists about the ongoing public procurement reform process. The CEO of BPPA explained the background, rationale, and necessity of the proposed PPR, 2025.

Dissemination workshop on new PPR, 2025 draws record crowd

The capital's Osmani Memorial Auditorium turned into a vibrant hub of energy and engagement as a large number of officers gathered to understand the sweeping reforms introduced in the new Public Procurement Rules (PPR), 2025. The unprecedented turnout reflected the keen interest among officers to understand the new directions in public procurement management.

Mr. S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed, who steered the entire process of formulating the PPR, 2025 as the Chief Executive Officer of the Bangladesh Public Procurement Authority (BPPA), was present as the key speaker in the workshop Organized by the Ministry of Housing and Public Works.

He elaborated on the key provisions and implications of the new rules during the workshop held on 8 October 2025 at the Osmani Memorial Auditorium in Dhaka.

The new PPR, 2025 came into effect on 28 September 2025, in tandem with the amended Public Procurement Act, 2006, marking a major milestone in the country's procurement reform journey.

The workshop aimed to brief officers under the Ministry of Housing and Public Works on the major changes and innovations introduced in the PPR, 2025. The event recorded the largest-ever participation in a public procurement workshop, with around 400 participants attending in person and another 500 joining online.

Mr. Md. Nazrul Islam, Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Public Works, presided over the workshop. Engineer Md. Reazul Islam, Chairman, Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (RAJUK), was also present on the occasion.

In the lively Question-Answer session, Mr. S. M. Moin Uddin Ahmed, and Mr. Shah Eyamin-Ul Islam, Director (Deputy Secretary), BPPA and National Procurement Trainer, together with Mr. Nazmul Islam Bhuiyan, Team Leader of the e-GP EOM team, responded to participants' queries and clarified technical aspects of the PPR 2025 on behalf of BPPA.

Mr. Shah Eyamin-Ul Islam, who has been deeply involved in the entire formulation process, shed light on the practical implications of the new rules for procuring entities and tenderers alike.
